EDUCATION YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP

Our WHY

- Need for K-12 Teachers
- Need for K-12 Non-Certified Employees
- Development of an education talent pipeline

Our PROCESS

- Use the previous models for our current Youth Apprenticeships and our current district work-based learning experiences. (Internship and Cooperative Learning students)
- Met with Trident Tech to understand the development of the program in partnership with U.S. Department of Labor
- Met with DD2 administrators and teachers to develop program outline

EDUCATION YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP

- Phase I – High School Student - Charleston Regional Youth Apprenticeship
 - Begin working in DD2 as Youth Apprentice in the summer.
 - Students will be paid \$10/hr.
 - Modeled after the current Co-Op program.
 - Students will begin taking dual-enrollment courses (free of charge).
 - Students will complete a list of competencies created by DD2.
 - Trident Tech and the U.S. Department of Labor will manage the student accounts and profiles in partnership with DD2.
 - DD2 = Employer Trident Tech = Facilitator

EDUCATION ADULT APPRENTICESHIP

- Phase 2 – Graduated High School Student – Adult Apprenticeship
- Highlights
 - Paid employment and mentoring from an employer partner (DD2 as a teacher aide or assistant)
 - A completion certificate for coursework that may be applied towards an associate degree
 - National credentials from the U.S. Department of Labor
 - Marketable skills for life
 - Continue course work with Coastal Carolina University online teaching (2x2) program.
 - Course work will be online while working at DD2 as a teacher aide/assistant/etc.
 - Goal = complete the program through Coastal Carolina, earn a bachelor's degree in education as a certified teacher, and work in DD2 as a certified teacher.

EDUCATION ADULT APPRENTICESHIP

- Phase 2 - Continued
- Eligibility
 - Be at least 18 years of age
 - Have a high school diploma or GED
 - Demonstrate academic readiness and responsibility
 - Provide a final, official high school transcript with a weighted GPA of 3.0 or higher from the last five years; qualifying SAT/ACT scores; or achieve qualifying next-generation ACCUPLACER scores (TTC placement test)
 - Achieve qualifying Placement Test scores
 - Provide a resume in Word format
 - Sign a Release of Information form
 - Be legally able to work in the United States

INTRODUCTION TO TEACHING - PATHWAY INFORMATION

CTE Completer Pathway

Below are the list of required courses and complementary courses for students to be qualified as a CTE completer in the Introduction to Teaching Pathway.

Required Courses:

- Introduction to Teaching 1 – EDUC 201
- Introduction to Teaching 2 – EDUC 241

Courses to Complete the CTE Program (only need 2)

- Teacher Cadet 1 (Required for Apprenticeship)
- Teacher Cadet 2 (Required for Apprenticeship)
- Entrepreneurship
- Web Page Design

All other Dual Enrollment Courses will be selected based on available offerings. Course transferability will also be considered when students are choosing dual credit options.
